

How to make your bunting.

1. You'll need paper or light card, access to a printer, string or ribbon, scissors (or craft knife & ruler), a stapler and 20 minutes of craft time!
2. Print your flags onto A4 paper. Be sure to print 'at actual size' to ensure maximum flag size. How many pages you print will depend on your desired bunting length. Three flags measure approx 42cm long when arranged end to end.
3. Cut out the bunting triangles along the outer edge.
